


# Worship God

### <u>Johnston Memorial Hospital Foundation 501(c)(3)</u> May 5<sup>th</sup> (Mother's Day Offering) GOAL: \$2,000.00

This offering replaces the Baptist Hospital offering in 2024. The Baptist Hospital was SOLD to Atrium Health in 2021/2022. At the April Spring meeting of the Baptist State Convention in 2022 a decision was made to cease funding through the cooperative funding of any financial support for the Baptist Hospital effective with the January 1, 2023 budget year.

Johnston Memorial Hospital Foundation for over three decades has been committed to improving the health and well-being of the communities they serve. Specifically:

- Angel Fund supports cancer patients by providing assistance to buy medication, transportation, wigs, and prosthetic devices
- Patient Assistance Fund helps patients with financial challenges pay for medication, treatments, and transportation
- Hospice Fund helps patients cover room, board, and other expenses at SECU Hospice House
- Heart Fund supports cardiac patients
- Healthy Kid's Fund provides scholarships to underserved youth in JoCo to get nutrition counseling and fitness instruction at HealthQuest
- Mobile Medical Bus operate and staff the medical bus in JoCo to offer services to anyone in the community such as blood pressure monitoring and treatment, diabetes screening, and was extensively used during COVID

The Foundation is 100% controlled locally and remains outside the umbrella of UNC. There is a special offering envelope in your offering box. Envelopes should also be in the pews.


